Registering for SNL Online courses

You can register for courses on Campus Connect by visiting <http://campusconnect.depaul.edu>. If you do not have Campus Connect information, you can contact the DePaul Technology Contact Center at 312-362-8765.

You can also register by submitting a registration form. The form can be downloaded from <http://www.snlonline.depaul.edu/WebMedia/StudentResources/RegistrationForm.doc> and faxed to 312-362-8809 or emailed to snregistration@depaul.edu.

All competences are two credits unless otherwise noted. Most courses can be taken for up to two competences, but not more than two.

All SNL Online courses have an enrollment limit. Instructors are not able to grant permission for students to register over the cap. There is no waiting list for online courses. You can always check Campus Connect for space availability.

Campus Connect

Your Campus Connect Credentials are mailed to you after your admission to SNL. Please keep that information in a safe place as you will refer to it often. If you do not have your Campus Connect information, you can call DePaul's Technology Contact Center (TCC) at 312-362-8765. The TCC will be able to provide you with your Campus Connect login credentials.

If you are not yet familiar with DePaul's Campus Connect system, you should login at <https://campusconnect.depaul.edu> using your assigned username and password and see the various options available to you, including registration, grades, billing, payment options, and more.

Accessing Your Online Course

You can login to your course in Blackboard at <http://oll.depaul.edu> with your Campus Connect username and password. **Please do NOT insert "www" into this URL; it will take you to an access portal that only allows part of your course to be viewed.** You can find your Campus Connect login credentials in the conditional admission letter that you received from SNL. If you do not have your Campus Connect



login credentials, please call DePaul's Technology Contact Center (TCC) at 312-362-8765. The TCC will be able to assist you with your Campus

Connect login credentials. We recommend that you login to your course several days before it begins during preview week, so that you can be sure your username and password are correct.

Using Blackboard

All winter quarter courses will be offered of the upgraded version of Blackboard. This new version has a redesigned gradebook and a more flexible Discussion tool. Look for instructions on how to use the new system on <http://www.itd.depaul.edu/website/blackboard8.asp#Student> and <http://www.blackboard.com/quicktutorials/quicktutorials.shtm>. In particular, try out the "Select all" and Collect buttons in your class discussion for easy viewing and response.

Participating in Discussion Board

Each online class has a website which contains course materials, links to research and discussion forum. In addition, each course has a study guide that explains course objectives and assignments.

The discussion forum is the main means of student and faculty interaction, and it addresses all issues related to content and procedures of the course. Students do not need to log on at any particular time, but do need to participate in the discussion several times each week throughout the duration of the course.

Email Address

You will be receiving important information via email at your “Preferred” email address listed on Campus Connect. If your email address has recently changed, you **must update your email address** under the “Home” and “Preferred” fields on Campus Connect. Log into Campus Connect at <https://campusconnect.depaul.edu> go to 'Demographic Portfolio' and update your email address.
